Bonfire and Fireworks Display – A bonfire and fireworks display will be held as usual at the Parish Council's Burgoyne Park on Wednesday 6th November see advert page 6. Please come along and enjoy this event as this will be the 25th occasion a bonfire has been held on Burgoyne Park. It is one of the best

supported events of the year – let's keep it that way.

Remembrance Weekend – Once again there will be two services held over the Remembrance weekend. The first organised by 'Aston Churches Together' will be held on Remembrance Sunday from 10.45 am around the War Memorial at Townend, Aston. The second will be held outside Aughton Early Years Centre around the Memorial Clock on Monday 11th November (Armistice Day) at 11.00 am.

<u>Grants</u> – Your Council continues to provide grants to local groups via its 'Small Grants Scheme'. The second round is now open for applications. The scheme is there to support 'not for profit' groups that benefit the community and I urge any such group to submit an application – see page 7.

<u>Competitions 2019</u> – The usual Parish Council sponsored competitions have been held during the summer which were all well supported. They included: an open fishing match held at Aston Ponds on July 3rd, a junior cricket tournament held at Aston Hall Cricket Club on August 4th, and a bowling tournament at Centenary Bowling Green on Sunday August 25th organised by Swallownest Bowling Club. 2019 Influenza Season

We are currently in the process of sending out invites for our Annual Flu jabs. We are trialling a new way of inviting patients which includes by text message or post. This year we are offering a selection of Walk In Sessions as well as appointments to book online. Please check for upcoming dates via our website www.Swallownesthealthcentre.co.uk,

Facebook Page or posters within the Surgery.

If we are aware you are housebound you do not need to contact us, either the Practice Nurse or District Nurse will come to you in due course.

Did Not Attends (DNA's)

We would like to say THANK YOU to patients who DO cancel their appointments when no longer needed and ask our patients who DON'T cancel their appointments to do so in the future, as unused appointments is a waste of GP's, Nurses and Healthcare Assistants time and stops patients who need an appointment from being seen. The average cost of an appointment is £30, and our monthly average of appointments not attended is 322 equating to £9,660.00 of wasted NHS resource.

We do monitor and write to patients who are recorded as missing 3 appointments without cancelling, stating that they will be removed from the practice list should this continue. We hope that this will be taken on board and you will help us and yourself by making every effort to attend or cancelling for someone else to use. #Use it, don't abuse it!

Evenings and Weekend Appointments

Extra appointments are available for all Rotherham patients and are designed to help people who struggle to attend their GP practice during the working week.

The appointments are routine which means they must be booked in advance and are not for urgent problems. You can book an appointment by contacting your usual GP Practice where you are registered, they will have access to all the available appointments.

The hubs will have appointments with any one or more of the following clinicians. GP, Advanced Nurse Practitioner, Practice Nurse and Healthcare Assistant. Our Receptionists will help to direct you to the right appointment type. Any registered Rotherham patient can access routine appointments at the following practices:- Dinnington, Broom Lane, Kimberworth Park Surgery, Dalton Surgery.

STAYING SAFE OVER THE BONFIRE PERIOD

This is a fun time of year for communities, and the last thing anyone wants to see is someone getting injured as a result of careless or dangerous behaviour. Everyone is encouraged to have a great time but to always think about what they are doing to avoid any upset or injury. It is important that people show respect for their communities, and do not disrupt the lives of others. At home, you can stay safe by following these simple tips:

- Always buy fireworks that they conform to British Standards. This means that they should have BS 7114 written on the box.
- Don't buy fireworks from anywhere you're not sure about, such as the back of a van or from a temporary, unlicensed market stall.
- Don't drink alcohol if setting off fireworks
- Always supervise children around fireworks and bonfires.
- If any fireworks look as if they haven't gone off after at least half an hour, soak them in a bucket of water and ask the Fire Service for advice.
- Don't site a bonfire too near your display or firework storage area, or close to fences
 or trees.
- Never use flammable liquids like paraffin or petrol to get it going as this can result in uncontrolled spread of fire or explosion.
- Take great care at all times. Plan your display in advance, make sure you know which fireworks are going to be let off and in what order.
- Don't burn dangerous rubbish (e.g. aerosols, gas cylinders, paint tins, tyres and bottles).
- Make sure your bonfire is put out completely.

GRANT FUNDING

PARISH COUNCIL GRANTS 2019/2020

The Parish Council earmarked funds in its budget for 2019/2020 to help groups/organisations that benefit the Community. Grants were made available to both established groups and specifically for new groups to assist them with start-up costs with a closing date of 31 August 2019 for the first round of applications.

The second round is now open for applications Closing date 31 January 2020

The maximum grant is £200 although this may be varied in exceptional circumstances. The money is available to assist 'not for profit' groups/organisations, which benefit local parishioners, however large or small.

Only those groups that make a contribution to the improvement of their community may apply. Your group will need to have its own bank account as grants cannot be paid into personal accounts.

If you wish to apply for a grant, application forms are available from the Parish Council Office (Monday - Friday 10.00 am - 12.30 pm) to where they should be returned by 31 January 2020.

Report on Aston Carnival 2019

Once again the sun shone on Aston Carnival, apart from one year when we were completely rained off, we have been very fortunate with the weather, and as far as the organising group are concerned, yet another huge success in achieving its main aim in promoting a free social gathering for families and friends from around Aston-cum-Aughton to an afternoon's entertainment.

Every year the organisers have some complication in planning the event. This year's major problem came at nearly the last minute; with just a couple of weeks to go we were informed that the police were not available to close the roads for the parade which should have started at Swallownest J & I School. Previously they have controlled the roads at the bottom of Swallownest, Wesley Ave and Worksop Road. Therefore a new plan for the parade had to be drawn up with the immediate thoughts of cancelling, especially as it was reported in last year's Natter that the parade was getting smaller.

NOT to be put off with minor details and because a parade sets the scene for the start of the event, we got permission to start from the Church of England School, and as we timed the start to coincide with any buses on Lodge Lane, the parade got under way and was clear of the road in 10 minutes.

We were very grateful to all the people who lined the route and helped to control traffic until we were off the road and on our way down Fairview Drive.

Those taking part in the parade thought it had worked better than starting at Swallownest. Mums and dads said it was a lot better for small children as the previous parades were 'a bit too far'. The band thought it better as they didn't get out of puff playing up the hill from the bottom of Swallownest. So it seems to have been improvement all round and the right decision. So watch this space.

THE ENTERTAINMENT - The organisers would like to thank all the dance groups and other performers who entertained us and this year we managed to keep nearer to the planned programme even though we had one group drop out at the last minute.

We are always on the lookout for different entertainment and as Knights in Battle who had been for the last couple of years couldn't make it this year we managed to get a Maypole organised by Derek and Enid Bailey.

Even though we were in August, not May, the Pole went down a real treat because after Janet Mitchell's dancers, who had danced around it before, it was the mums and dads. CHECK OUT THE PHOTOGRAPHS ON OUR WEBSITE.

Dinnington Colliery Brass Band who play in the parade always enjoy the afternoon, as when they have regained their wind, they play a spot at the edge of the arena which is always enjoyed by those who like to sit awhile after walking around the stalls. Please note the band is always on the lookout for new members.

Stall Holders - The organisers hope the stall holders raising money for charities or their groups funds had a successful day and will wish to join us again next year. We are very grateful for the grants we receive and the support given by all the stall holders.

Finances - The cost of last year's (2018) carnival was in excess of £2,500.00 with over £1,500.00 for statutory insurance, medical cover, the road closure costs to conform with the Highways Acts, and the various licences needed. Plus the fees for some of the performers in the arena.

The remainder goes on printing the programme and advertising posters. Although we receive fees from adverts and some grant income, we still have to raise money through the stall holders.

The carnival finances do not usually get finalised until the end of the year but the overall forecasted cost is roughly the same as the last year. Any surplus generated from the event will be passed on to local charities the committee supports on behalf of our community.

The committee wish to thank Aston-cum-Aughton Parish Council for its help; all the businesses that placed an advert in the programme (who now have links on our website), and all those who acted as marshals in the parade or helped to set out the field.

Finally you, the community at large, for all your support which we hope will continue for next year's Carnival on **Saturday 1st August 2020**.

Next year's Carnival falls on Yorkshire Day which we would like to make as the theme for the day so please come up with any ideas and contact the organisers on 01142 873718 or through our Facebook page.
