#### **Online appointments**

From 1st July 2019 we have improved access to the Health Centre by offering more appointments online. It is your responsibility to ensure that you book the correct type of appointment e.g. The Minor Ailments clinics are run bv Advanced Nurse Practitioners who are only able to see specific

issues which are listed under the section shown on the appointments page on our website. Please note when booking these appointments you should include the reason for your visit.

You can now book directly with our **Healthcare Assistants** for blood test or Blood Pressure only. Please note your blood test must have been requested by your doctor. If you book an appointment with our Healthcare Assistant and it is not for a blood test or blood pressure you will be asked to rebook appropriately.

Please note that **GP appointments** are 10 minutes and usually to deal with a single medical problem. Please do not allow multiple medical problems to build up and then ask the GP to sort them all out within these 10 minutes; there will not be enough time and the GP ideally would like to resolve the problem fully. If you require additional time we recommend you book a double appointment either over the telephone or at reception as these are not available online.

If you wish to sign up to the online system, please come to reception with photo ID and proof of your address, we can then provide you with details to access this service.

# Please make sure you book an appropriate appointment otherwise this will be wasting your time as well as that of our clinicians and admin staff.

## **CRIME PREVENTION**

#### Don't leave your home vulnerable to sneak in burglars

Now Summer is here and the weather improved most of us may well look to spend more time outdoors in our garden. Or if we stay indoors we might choose to leave windows and doors open to get a cooler breeze blowing through the house. Given our propensity to do both of the afore mentioned at this time of year, it might come as no surprise to hear that sneak in burglaries often increase in number in the Summer months.



Listed below are some points to consider, which if followed may reduce the chances of you falling foul of sneak in burglars.

- If you are going into the garden and leaving no-one in the house, close and secure all the windows, and then secure the house doors before entering the garden.
- If you are in the house, don't leave windows or external doors open in rooms that are unoccupied. Before leaving a room, ensure that you secure the windows therein.
- When you are in the house, consider dropping the latch on the door or securing the door with the door chain. Either of these suggestions will allow you easy egress from the house in an emergency, but will also deny offenders easy access to the house. Fitting a battery operated door chime to your door, will give you an audible warning if the door is opened, and this noise will also startle would be offenders.
- Don't leave valuable items, such as laptops, smartphones, tablets, car keys, cash or handbags, on open display in unoccupied rooms.
- Be a good neighbour. Report persons acting suspiciously around neighbours' homes, to the Police, as soon as possible.

Also remember to take time and prepare for going on your well-earned summer holiday – it's not just about sun cream or foreign currency you need to think about securing your home when you leave, cancelling deliveries and installing time switches on lights.



## **Drivers Targeted with Fake Fines**

#### What you need to know

We have received notification that there has been an increase in reports and intelligence where elderly victims are being targeted by individuals purporting to be police officers or traffic wardens. The victims are being approached whilst parked in a car park and are told by the suspect that they have parked illegally or broken a speed limit and a photo has been taken of their car for 'evidence'.

Victims are advised that they will face a substantial penalty fine unless they pay a smaller upfront fee immediately. Victims, who opt for paying the smaller penalty, will be directed to a parking meter and asked to enter their card and PIN. These parking meters have been tampered with by the suspect in order to retain the card.

Once the victim inserts their card and are asked for their PIN, the victims are shoulder surfed for their PIN by the suspect. Once victims input their PIN, the card is retained by the machine and victims are told by the suspect to seek help from the company who operates the parking meter or their bank.

#### What you need to do

- If you are suspicious about the <u>authenticity</u> of the fine, do not pay it until you have <u>verified</u> it with your local council.
- Always <u>shield your PIN</u> from view when using an ATM machine, and <u>never</u> share your PIN with anyone.
- If your bank card is retained by an ATM machine, contact your bank **immediately** to inform them.

#### Heritage Open Days 2019

#### William Layne Reading Room - Aughton Lane Aston

#### Friday 13 September 2019 – 6.00 pm – 8.00 pm Saturday 14 September – 10.00 am – 4.00 pm

This year is the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Heritage Open Days (<u>www.heritageopendays.org.uk</u>). It has been an annual event, held in September, when local groups and individuals opened buildings that are not generally open to the public. Last year, for the first time, open days were held over two long weekends. This proved to be a popular decision and will be repeated this year, from Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> September to Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> September 2019.

Every year since 2006, Aston-cum-Aughton History Group has opened the William Layne Reading Room and once again it will be open on Friday 13<sup>th</sup> September from 6.00 pm to 8.00 pm and Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> September from 10.00 am to 4.00 pm. Visitors can browse their albums of photographs showing the changes over the years in Aston, Aughton, Fence, Swallownest and Ulley. Also on view will be old maps of the area showing how the Parish has grown, especially since the opening of coal mines in Fence and Aston in the 1800s. Also available are albums of information about local men who died in the two World Wars.



The gravestones in the churchyard have been photographed and recorded and this information will be on view, as well as a copy of all marriages held in Aston Church from 1560 to 1938. Local history books published by the History Group will also be on sale.

Please come along, everyone is welcome to visit the Reading Room, which was the first school built in Aston in 1734 by the Rector at the time, Revd. Francis Lockyer. It is an important part of the heritage of our Parish. At the same time you can view local history documents and old photographs, have a cup of tea and reminisce about old times. If you have any old documents, maps or photographs of people and places, please bring them along. The History Group would like to copy them and make them part of our history. The originals will be returned to you.

This year, Aston All Saints Church will be open on Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> September from 12.30 pm until 3.30 p.m. Vestments, artefacts, archives and silver etc. will be on display and it is hoped to do tower tours as well. At 3.00 pm there will be a short talk on the history of the church in Aston.

# GRANT FUNDING

## ASTON-CUM-AUGHTON

## PARISH COUNCIL GRANTS 2019/2020

Once again the Parish Council has earmarked funds in its budget to help groups/organisations that benefit the Community.

There is a maximum  $\pm 3500$  available from which grants will be awarded by the Parish Council's General Purposes Committee for established groups and for new groups (to assist them with start-up costs).

The usual maximum grant awarded is  $\pounds$ 200 although this may be varied in exceptional circumstances. The money is available to assist 'not for profit' groups/organisations which benefit local parishioners however large or small.

Only those groups that make a contribution to the improvement in quality of life for parishioners may apply. Your group will need to have its own bank account as grants cannot be paid into personal accounts.

If you wish to apply for a grant, application forms are available from the Parish Council Office (Monday - Friday 10.00 am - 12.30 pm).

Applications for start-up grants will be considered on an ongoing basis from **1 April 2019** 

The first closing date for applications from established groups is **31 August 2019**
